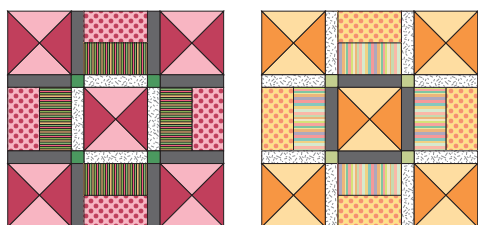


There are nine blocks in Judy's quilt, five red/pink blocks and four orange/yellow blocks.

4 Blocks

Cut the fabric

Most stripes run down the length of the fabric; therefore, cut strips across the width. If the stripe runs across the width of the fabric, cut the strips down the length.

Broad or variegated stripes must be cut exactly the same for each sashing strip. Centre the stripe in the middle of the strip, otherwise the design can look messy. This is not necessary if the stripes are narrow.

From each of the red, pink, orange and yellow solid fabrics, cut:

- 2 strips, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in x width of fabric and cross cut the red and pink strips into 13, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in squares and the orange and yellow strips into 10, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in squares

From the red/pink polka dot print fabric, cut:

- 3 strips, $2\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric

From the orange/yellow polka dot print fabric, cut:

- 2 strips, $2\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric

From the first multicoloured striped fabric, cut:

- 3 strips, $2\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric

From the second multicoloured striped fabric, cut:

- 2 strips, $2\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric

From the dark green solid fabric, cut:

- 1 strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric
- 1 strip, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in x width of fabric and cross cut into 8, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in squares (sashing squares)

From the light green solid fabric, cut:

- 1 strip, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric

From each of the black and white print fabrics, cut:

- 1 strip, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric
- 5 strips, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in x width of fabric and cross cut 36, $1\frac{1}{2}$ in x $4\frac{1}{2}$ in strips

From the dark black and white print fabric, cut:

- 1 strip, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in x width of fabric and cross cut 8, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in squares (sashing squares)

From the black and white striped fabric, cut:

- 12 strips, 3in x width of fabric and cross cut 24 identical strips, 3in x $14\frac{1}{2}$ in (sashings)

From the length of the black/pink print fabric for the border, cut:

- 2 strips, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in x $52\frac{1}{2}$ in
- 2 strips, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in x $62\frac{1}{2}$ in

Cut the backing fabric in half and from each piece, cut:

- 2 strips, 3in x length of fabric (binding)

Make the blocks

1. Arrange the red/pink and orange/yellow squares in pairs. Spray the squares lightly with starch and gently press the

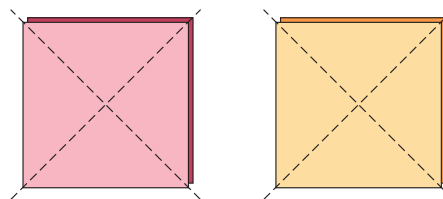

squares together with a dry iron. Do not wet the fabrics as the squares will stretch out of shape.

2. Cut each pair of squares twice across the diagonal following Diagram 1.

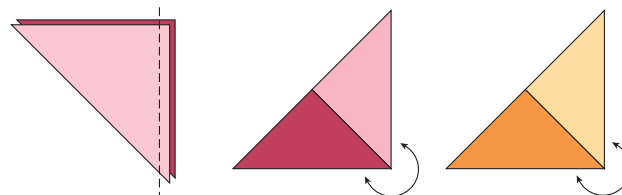

3. Following Diagram 2, join pairs of triangles together along one short side. Make 50 red/pink units and 40 orange/yellow units. Press the seam allowances towards the darker fabrics.

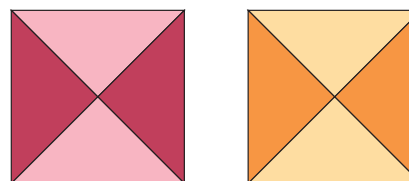

4. Following Diagram 3, stitch the red/pink units together to make 25 squares and the orange/yellow units together to make 20 squares. Butt the seam allowances together at the intersections. Press and trim tails.

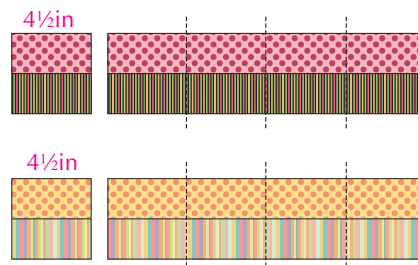

5. Following Diagram 4, stitch each of the red/pink polka dot strips and first multicoloured striped strips together to make three strip sets. Cross cut into 20, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in squares. Stitch each of the orange/yellow polka dot strips and second multicoloured striped strips to make two strip sets. Cross cut into 16, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in squares.

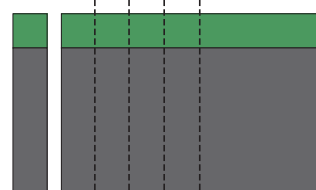
